



TRI Graduate Level Internship Description:

Students selected for an internship through The Reentry Initiative will be given opportunities to work inside Denver Women's Correctional Facility (DWCF) teaching an evidence-based Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT) group curriculum geared to address inmates' criminogenic thinking patterns. Interns will also be provided one-on-one caseloads with post-release inmates/clients and work with them to achieve self-sufficiency in the Denver Metro Area or Longmont Area. Interns will work one-on-one with Program Manager to develop inmate transition plans, work with prison staff to coordinate post-release planning and care, have the opportunity to co-facilitate groups inside the prison, provide one-on-one counseling to post-release clients and administer assessments for treatment of mental health or co-occurring disorders. Interns will also experience and learn about the ever-changing and newly adapting criminal justice system.

We prefer to select interns for 1-year-long placement with availability Monday and Wednesday evening classes at DWCF from 6 pm - 8 pm weekly and daily hours 9am – 5pm.

Daytime hours, Monday through Friday will be flexible and based within the Denver Metro or Longmont area but could potentially incur travel. TRI provides extensive training in Trauma Informed Care practices, PREA training and standards, Self-Care/Boundaries, CBT Modality for Groups, safety standards for community and prison care of clients, and clinical case management training. Students are expected to attend monthly staff meetings, weekly supervision with their site supervisor, ongoing case consultation with Program Manager and will be trained in documentation, assessment and best practices within the prison system.

Days/Times at Site:

Orientation to TRI: *Will occur prior to or within the first week of placement*

2 days/8 hours: Location – TRI Welcome Back Center 402 Kimbark Street, Longmont CO 80502

DENVER PLACEMENT:

Evening hours for groups inside the prison; daytime clinical case management:

- **UCRI Classes Monday and Wednesday Evenings:**
 - *Will begin within the first two weeks of placement 2-4 hours/week*
 - 6 pm – 8:30 pm: Location - Denver Women's Correctional Facility (DWCF) Students to develop schedule of observing/teaching classes at start of internship; Opportunity to Co-Facilitate throughout placement

If you have a short-term placement you will only be permitted inside DWCF up to 4 times on Red Badge and have to be accompanied by TRI Staff. TRI staff encourage all Students to obtain Green Badge. Please see below on DOC Volunteer Program.



- **Department of Corrections (DOC) Volunteer Program Orientation:**
 - *Will complete application upon acceptance to TRI internship program and arrange to potentially attend orientation at DOC within the first 2 months of placement (DOC scheduler and current waitlist will determine class availability)*
 - *8 Hours at DWCF or another approved location on Saturday's offered monthly.* This training is to obtain a Green Badge for access into DWCF without prior approval or with escort from TRI staff. This is mandatory for all year long student placements and strongly encouraged to all students for easy access inside DWCF.
- **Individual Clinical Case Management/Individual Counseling Post-Release: Denver**
 - Office: Elevations Church, 15600 E Alameda Pkwy, Aurora, CO 80017
 - Case load of approximately 1-4 Post-Release Clients based in the Denver Metro area Community, including: Community Corrections, Work Placement programs, Transitional Housing Programs, Substance Abuse Treatment locations, etc.
 - Intern is expected to meet with each of their clients 1-2 times a week to provide Updates to Clinical Case Management Self Sufficiency Plans and one-on-one counseling. Daily hours 9am – 5pm, Monday through Wednesday (Thursday and Friday: Office Admin Days and appointment only). Daytime hours will be flexible dependent on the Interns availability and the client's availability and based within the Denver Metro area.
 - *Intern must have reliable transportation with valid license and insurance. Interns are not permitted to drive clients.*
- Co-Facilitating UCRI Continuing Education Booster Sessions for Post-Release Clients; Co-Facilitating Group therapies with contracted agencies (such as Art Therapy, Pet Therapy, etc.)
- 1x/week meeting with supervisor for continued supervision. Can be flexible with skype/phone supervision sessions.

Longmont/Boulder County Placement: M-F hours vary based on need

- Office 402 Kimbark Street, Longmont CO 80501
- Weekly meetings with TRI Post-Release/WAGEES Clients: 4-8 hours per week, caseload of 5-8 clients

Weekly meetings with clients at TRI Welcome Back Center in Longmont or Boulder County Area and TRI House Clients for purpose of clinical case management, self-sufficiency transition, and ongoing support.

- LIFE Skills/UCRI Groups at WAGEES Center: All students will have opportunities to run life skills and UCRI curriculum groups.

Life Skills: 1hour/week (Days/Times TBD)

UCRI: 4 hours/week (1 hour for case notes, 3 hours for class per week)



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
